PICTURE PERFECT

Including one large image is a great way to bring life and colour to a large kitchen as well as defining a specific space and giving the room personality. Sallie explains how to make the right choice

Match the scheme For a feature wall that's striking but not overwhelming, go for tones and a style that will complement your existing decor. In a period home, a style featuring vintage art or photography will be dramatic as well as looking authentic and natural. Plant power Think about the balance within the room - if you have highly detailed tiles or curtains, a simple mural might be best, but in a neutral kitchen you have free rein to pick a daring style. Designs with botanical themes bring the outdoors in and suit most schemes. Premium finishes For a more luxurious feel, choose a style printed on textured linen paper (great for imperfect walls) or try a vintage design printed on Oriental paper, which has a softer finish and feels handmade. Both types are best kept away from high traffic and wet areas, and will need to be applied by a professional decorator. If there's a chance your mural might get damaged, choose one that's scratch resistant. Full works Before you buy, order a sample and allow it to sit in the space for a few days so you can see how it looks in all lights. A mural will always be at its most inspiring on a full wall, but also works well for tricky areas when created in bespoke sizes - just be sure to measure twice so you order the correct size and go for one with a low-tack adhesive backing, so it can be easily removed if needed. Alternatively, if you prefer the flexibility of artwork over a mural, several statement pieces in similar styles grouped together will create an impressive feature wall that can be updated as often as you like.
